

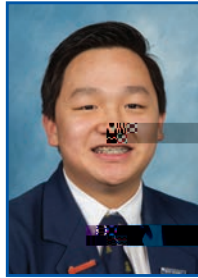

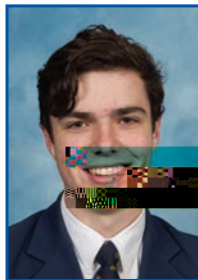

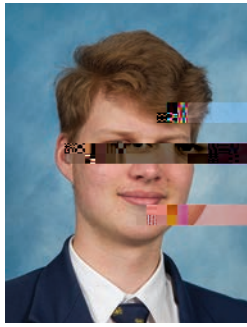

My advice for excelling in the HSC is to be self-motivated. Your attitude determines your success so be organised, start things early, set goals, and never give up, because hard work pays off.



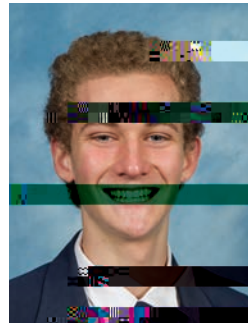
